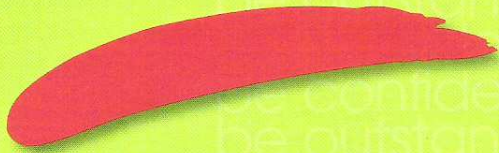
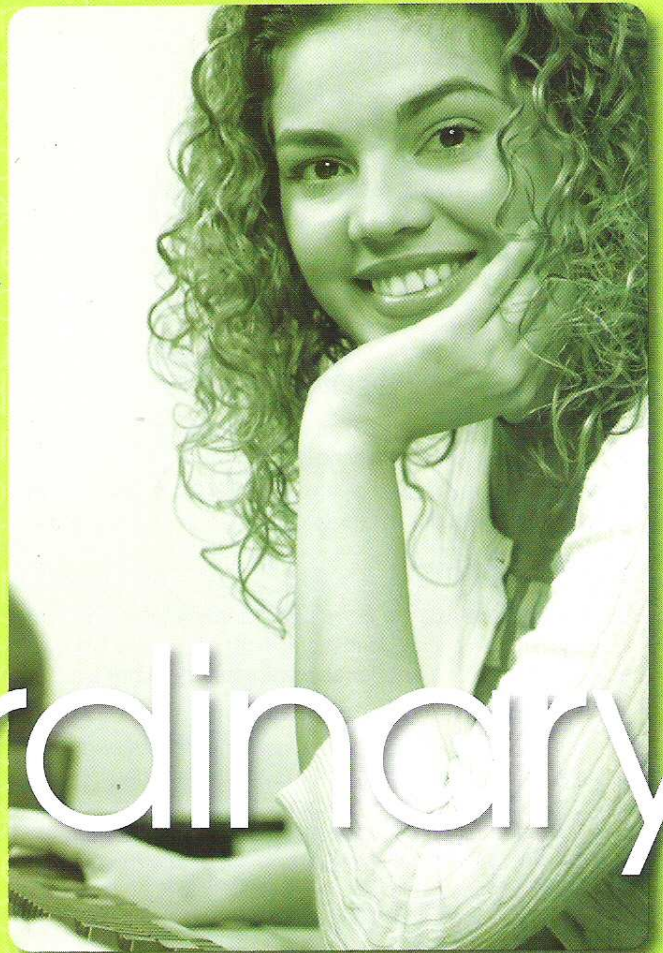

HOW TO REGISTER ONLINE

Why Take the ACT?

- The ACT® test is accepted by all four-year colleges and universities in the United States.
- The ACT is based on information you are learning in high school.
- The ACT is more than a test. The information you provide when you register, along with your ACT results, can help you plan for life after high school.
- The ACT is a good value. The ACT offers both a college admissions test and a career planning component.

What You Need to Know Before You Register

Choosing Your Test Option

Two test options are available:

1. **The ACT (No Writing)**, which is made up of four multiple-choice tests in English, mathematics, reading, and science.
2. **The ACT Plus Writing**, which includes the four multiple-choice tests plus a 30-minute Writing Test. Check www.actstudent.org for a searchable list of colleges that have told us about their policies—whether they require, recommend, or do not need results from the ACT Writing Test.

Choosing Your Test Date

- Keep in mind the deadlines of the colleges and scholarship programs you are considering.
- You cannot expect to receive your scores from one test date in time to register for the next one.

Retest Restriction

You may take the ACT no more than 12 times total. This restriction applies even if your scores from a test date are cancelled by you or by ACT. See www.actstudent.org for more information.

You may not receive scores from more than one test date per national administration (Saturday, non-Saturday, or rescheduled test date arranged by ACT). If you are admitted and allowed to test a second time, we will report only the scores from the first test. The second set of scores will be cancelled without refund.

When You're Ready to Register

Create Your ACT Web Account

Before you can register, you will need to create your free ACT Web account at www.actstudent.org. This account also allows you to:

- Change your Test Option, Test Date, or Test Center.
- Add, change, or delete college choices.
- Receive e-mail updates from ACT about your registration.
- View your scores at no charge.
- Request and pay for score reports to additional colleges after you test.

Special Circumstances

If any of these situations apply to you, please read the information below BEFORE registering. You may need to follow different instructions.

Do You Need a Fee Waiver?

If you cannot afford to pay the basic fee, ask your high school counselor if you are eligible for an ACT Fee Waiver.

Do Your Religious Beliefs Prohibit Saturday Testing?

Non-Saturday test centers are noted at www.actstudent.org. If a non-Saturday center is scheduled within 50 miles of your home on any test date, register for that center on that test date. (If not, see below.)

Do You Have a Diagnosed Disability that Requires Test Accommodations?

Before you try to register, click on the "Students with Disabilities" link at www.actstudent.org for information about:

Center Testing #1: Standard Time with Accommodations

Center Testing #2: Extended Time (50% time extension)

Special Testing: For students who require **more** than 50% time extension, need to test over multiple days, or need to test with alternate formats such as Braille, cassettes, audio DVDs, or a reader.

Follow the on-screen instructions to request the type of accommodations you need.

After You Register

Your Admission Ticket

As soon as your test center assignment is confirmed, you will be prompted to print your admission ticket. **You must bring your admission ticket with you to the test center on test day.** It has information you will need to accurately complete your answer document. Otherwise, your scores will be delayed.

Identification Required

Acceptable identification must be presented at check-in or you will not be admitted to test. For detailed information, review your admission ticket or go to www.actstudent.org.

Standby Testing

If you miss the late registration deadline for a test date, you can try to test as a standby on test day.

What You Need to Know

- You are **not** guaranteed admission.
- Check www.actstudent.org to see which centers are scheduled to test on your test date.
- Test centers admit standbys on a first-come, first-admitted basis and **only** if there is space available after all registered students have been admitted for their test option.
- Because advance arrangements are required, standby examinees cannot request accommodations.
- You will not be able to add, change, or cancel score reports.
- **Do not bring payment to the test center.** We will bill you for all fees due.

What You Must Do

1. Create or log in to your ACT Web account.
2. Write down the ACT ID you are assigned.
3. Download and print the Standby Request Form.
4. Fill out the entire form completely and accurately. If you do not provide an accurate and legible ACT ID, you will not receive scores.
5. Arrive at the test center **before** 8:00 a.m. with your completed form and acceptable identification. You will not be admitted to test without them.

Choose "Send a question by e-mail" if you want to contact specific departments.

Making Changes to Your Registration

You can request and pay for the changes below through your ACT Web account before the registration deadline. If you make the change during the late period, you will need to pay the additional late fee.

Test Center Change: For the same test date.

Test Date Change: If you do not test on your original test date.

Test Option Change: Add or drop the ACT Writing Test.

If you miss the deadline, you can try to make a change on test day. Take your admission ticket to your preferred test center on your preferred test date and tell the test supervisor what change you want to make. If space is available, you will be allowed to make the change, and we will bill you for all fees due.

ACT Fees 2010–2011

You must use a valid American Express, DISCOVER, MasterCard, or VISA (or waiver/voucher, if applicable) to register online. Fees are nonrefundable unless noted with an asterisk.

Basic Fee per Test Option

(includes up to four valid college codes listed when you register)

ACT Plus Writing	\$48.00*

*\$15.00 fee for the Writing Test is refundable if you are absent on test day or you change your Test Option to the ACT (No Writing) before testing begins.

Test center change (for same test date) + \$20.00

Re-registration by phone (to retake the test)	Basic Fee + \$12.00
Standby testing	Basic Fee + \$41.00
Test Date Change	additional \$20.00

(For different date only if you do not test on the original date.) You will be charged the basic fee for your test option plus \$20.00. Your basic fee for the original test date will be promptly refunded.

On Test Day

- Report to your assigned test center by the time shown on your admission ticket, normally 8:00 a.m. You will not be admitted to test if you are late.
- Be prepared to begin testing after all examinees are seated.
- A break is scheduled after the first two tests.
- You will normally be dismissed about 12:15 p.m. if you take the ACT (No Writing) or about 1:00 p.m. if you take the ACT Plus Writing.
- Once you break the seal on your test booklet, you cannot later request a Test Date Change, even if you do not complete testing.

Bring the following items to the test center:

- **Your admission ticket.**
- Acceptable identification. (See www.actstudent.org for details.)
- Sharpened soft lead No. 2 pencils with good erasers (no mechanical pencils or ink pens).
- A watch to pace yourself. (Your supervisor will announce when you have 5 minutes remaining on each test.)
- A **permitted** calculator. (See www.actstudent.org for details.)

Do NOT bring any of the following items:

- Food or drink, including water.
- Books, dictionaries, notes, scratch paper, or other aids.
- Highlighters, colored pens or pencils, or correction fluid.
- **Any** electronic device other than a permitted calculator (e.g., timer, cell phone, media player, PDA).
- Reading material.
- Tobacco in any form.

How Soon Scores Are Ready

Scores on the Web

- Your multiple-choice scores, including your Composite score, can be viewed online as soon as they are ready, normally beginning about 3 weeks after the test date.
- If you take the ACT Plus Writing, your Writing scores will be added as soon as they are available, usually about 2 weeks after your multiple-choice scores are posted.
- Schedules are at www.actstudent.org along with reasons why some scores take longer.

Reporting Schedule—Mail

- ACT (No Writing) reports are normally mailed 3–8 weeks after the test date.
- ACT Plus Writing reports are mailed only when all your scores are available, including Writing, normally 5–8 weeks after the test date.
- Score reports can be mailed only if you provide an accurate and complete address when you register.

Problems on Test Day

- In the event of inclement weather, listen to your local radio or TV station for announcements about the status of your test center. ACT will post reschedule information on www.actstudent.org.
- If you have to leave the test center before completing all your tests, you must decide whether or not you want answer document scored AND inform the room supervisor or test supervisor of your decision. If you do not, your answer document will be scored.
- If you decide to stop testing after you break the seal on your test booklet, but later decide to test again, you must re-register and pay the **full** basic fee for your test option.
